

CLINICAL SERVICES

- ✓ **Adult and Family**
Evaluation and therapy provided to children/adults/families affected by child abuse and neglect, as well as to emotionally disturbed children and adults.
- ✓ **Family Preservation**
Assessments, in-home treatment, and care coordination for families in which a child has a serious emotional disturbance or is at risk of out-of-home placement.
- ✓ **Alcohol and Drug**
Evaluation, adult and adolescent treatment programs, short- and long-term residential services, aftercare and outreach. Priority services for pregnant women and IV drug users.
- ✓ **Extended Care and Treatment**
Psychosocial rehabilitation programming for adults with serious mental illness; case management, day treatment, residential, aftercare, pre-vocational and vocational support.
- ✓ **Insight Program**
Treatment services for individuals with mental illness and mental retardation.
- ✓ **Ruth Meiers Adolescent Center**
Residential treatment facility for emotionally disturbed adolescents; phone number is 701-795-3870.
- ✓ **24-Hour Crisis Intervention**
For individuals and families in emergency situations. The crisis line number is 775-0525 or 1-800-845-3731.

VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION CONSULTING & SERVICES

Provides the planning and services necessary to enable an individual with a disability to successfully enter the world of work and/or to become as self-sufficient as possible.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Psychiatric evaluation and follow-up, psychiatric nursing and medication management, available to persons who meet the admission criteria for clinical services.

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES SERVICES

For people with mental retardation or closely related conditions that may require the same type of intervention and/or service coordination.

- ✓ **Case management:** individual service planning; access to services and funding; quality monitoring; follow-along
- ✓ **Family support services**

COMMUNITY SERVICES

- ✓ **Child Welfare**
Child protective services, foster care, shelter care, and child care licensing are among the programs offered in conjunction with county social services agencies. Community education on these topics is also available.
- ✓ **Foster Grandparent Program**
Low income seniors give love and individual attention to special needs children in community settings in several regions of the state.
- ✓ **Aging**
Consultation and support for seniors and Title III providers; adult protective services.
- ✓ **Family Caregiver Support Program**
Information, training, respite are for eligible caregivers of older adults and for older grandparents/relatives caring for a child age 18 or younger.

Some services are charged a flat fee and some are at no fee, including information and referral services. When an individual has health insurance, we will bill the insurance company and any unpaid balance may be the responsibility of the individual. No one is denied services because of inability to pay.
